The 21th edition of “Blue Metropolis Bleu Festival” brings the Spanish writer José Manuel Fajardo to participate in the Spanish and Portuguese literature program.

Spanish writer [José Manuel Fajardo](#) has been invited to participate in 21st *Blue Metropolis Festival*, which runs May 3–5. The Blue Metropolis Foundation produces this annual international literary festival, and offers a wide range of educational and social programs year-round, which use reading and writing as therapeutic tools, encourage academic perseverance, and fight against poverty and isolation.

Fajardo was born in Granada, Spain, in 1957. Besides being a novel-writer, he has contributed with his work in the fields of journalism and history. He is also a French translator. He lived in the Basque Country, Spain, France and Portugal. Some of his novels are *Lettre du bout du monde* (Flammarion), *Les Imposteurs* (Métailié, 2000), *Les Démons à ma porte* (Métailié, 2002) and *L'eau à la bouche* (Métailié, 2006). In 2002, he received the Charles Brisset Award for *Les Démons à ma porte*.
