The Festival Quartiers Danses (FQD) has made it its mission to democratize contemporary dance and all its forms and hybrids by making it more accessible to all audiences in traditional and unusual venues. The Festival mostly offers shows from local artists, but also from national and international creators. It adopts a multidisciplinary approach of original dance that comprises show presentation, performances, installations, films, exhibits, meetings and discussions, and cultural mediation workshops.

- In this new cycle of teaching, Sonia Gómez has chosen Québec dancer and comedian Marc Béland as bearer of contemporary dance's fiery "pop" era. *Dancers* here unites the original solo, its reinterpretation by Marc Béland, and the duo born from this artistic complicity. In addition to questioning the aging body and its place in the cultural scene, we discover above all a joyful and delicate quest for a dance for two, uncomplicated and without preconditions.
